Two former CMIers are in our thoughts this Month.....Charlotte Axiotis and Chuck Hewett.

Charlotte and Marcus moved out of the metro (read that CMI area) and up to the Lake Mille Lacs area a few years ago. Their PO address is in Aitkin, MN. Charlotte was 64 when she died at her home on May 24, 2006.

She was born in Calloway County Kentucky the daughter of Horace and Frances McKenzie. She married Marcus Axiotus in 1963 at Hampton, IA. Charlotte attended Murray State University in Murray, Kentucky for two years and then continued her education at the University of Minnesota where she received her BS degree as well as her Masters Degree in Children's Literature.
