"Talk about the unexpected—look at the 1965 Corvair! There were enough news "leaks" about Ford's Mustang that anybody who didn't know all about the car by its introduction in April just wasn't reading the papers. The Corvair, on the other hand, should be a shock to just about everybody; it's wholly unlike any previous Corvair and wholly unlike what many people expected."

The above quote was from the October, 1964 issue of Car and Driver magazine as the introduction to the second generation 1965 Corvair, which came out 50 years ago. The article went on to say that the styling "speaks for itself; it is undoubtedly the sexiest-looking American car of the new crop and possibly one of the most handsome cars in the world."

As we all know, all this high praise was, for the most part, lost in translation. Pony cars, and later muscle cars, gave the American drivers what they wanted; fast acceleration in a straight line, handling be damned. However the Corvair could and did handle extremely well with the new suspension design in 1965 and was the closest thing to European cars Detriot had ever built.

Anyone who watches *Top Gear UK* will know that American car makers are still being ridiculed for producing cars that don't go around corners.

On the cover of *Hemmings Classic Car* were some more Corvairs, specifically the Monza GT and Monza SS. They are featured in an article about Chevrolet Concept Cars of the 1960s. One concept





#### New London to New Brighton Antique Car Run

#### Saturday, August 9, 2014

The New London to New Brighton Antique Car Run began in 1987 during New Brighton's Centennial Celebration. The City added the Run to its calendar of events that year as a way of strengthening its namesake ties to Brighton, England. Complete with a visit by the Mayor of Brighton and other English guests, the 1st Annual Antique Car Run was held with 17 participants. The Antique Car Run is an American version of the prestigious London to Brighton Commemorative Run held annually in England.

The New London to New Brighton Antique Car Run is a 120 mile tour of the Minnesota countryside. Unlike the English event run through the crowded streets of the big city, this Minnesota Run starts in the small rural community of New London and takes participants past sumptuous fields and quaint farm houses as it winds its way into the suburban city of New Brighton.

All vehicles from 1908 or earlier, or any 1 or 2 cylinder vehicles up to 1915 are eligible to participate in the New London to New Brighton Antique Car Run. This includes bikes, motorcycles, steam and electric cars as well. An average of 60 cars participate annually. The Run is held the 2nd Saturday in August annually. This year, the 28<sup>th</sup> annual run, featured 62 Grand Tour participants on the Official Roster (54 started, 52 finished).

These pictures were taken on the road to the Buffalo High School where the participants took a mandatory lunch break and joined the Wright County Car Club and Corvair Minnesota for an impromptu car show.




