JUNE 2016 Fuel Pump update

We all know that the CORVAIR fuel pumps fail, often times with catastrophic results. Many years ago I determined that the hole in the fuel pump diaphragm is the culprit and have recently developed a modification to 'remedy that situation'. I am using old failed pumps for parts to assemble 'good' pumps which incorporate my modifications. Along the way I have uncovered a SECOND reason for these failures of our pumps.

PROGRESS REPORT: In the base of a CORVAIR fuel pump there is a ¼" rod sticking out. This rod is pushed by the internal Engine parts (the fuel pump pushrod touching the Fuel Pump Eccentric), this rod reaches up inside the pump to push on the diaphragms. There is room inside the pump for the parts to move 0.200"...MAX! The engine cam moves up/down a total of 0.125". All of the internal pumping has to happen using that .125" dimension within the .200" window. In measuring the pump-rods in my supply of used pumps I find these rods vary in length by .150"! This alone causes many of the pumps to operate right out of the .200" window. Let's review: We know the ¼" rod is attached to the two




pumping diaphragms through a hole punched in the rubberized fabric. This hole is where the CORVAIR fuel pump does the hard flexing. What has now been discovered is a second cause of failure; that in some pumps the rubber diaphragm is forced to operate outside of its design range by pushrods that are "out of spec".

This leads us to the question, "what is the correct length of that pushrod?" Turns out that is not an easy question to answer because all fuel pumps are held in the same place by a tapered screw. That screw is in a separate part of the pump, called the base. The position of the screw-hole in the base unit varies as much as .050". Yes, that right, not only are the pushrods not all the same length but the casting that make the base housing are not the same. This is why it is difficult to figure out a benchmark measurement to use in assembling these modified pumps.

The pump is mounted on the engine and positioned with a tapered screw so that the pump-rod can start in exactly the correct location. Therefore to determine the optimal length of pump-rod all measurements have to be made from that screw. To accurately read "where is the hole" for the tapered screw, I cut of a "tapered screw" from an engine - - to use as a tool






position of the diaphragms of the pump. This ability to work from the tapered hole allows me to define an acceptable base unit upon which I can construct a useable (good) pump.



As I was measuring my used parts I found the bottom edge of the base casting is not an acceptable reference point. Looking at the base unit shown on the left... I have labeled, A

and B. 'A' is what I was measuring until I found that all the units I measured that have 'A' the same do not have 'B' the

same. Some are off 0.050". I was measuring 'A' because it is easier, thinking that 'A' would tell me 'B'. 'B' is the measurement that I need to know as it says how far the first diaphragm is from the engine's F P cam, referenced by the tapered hole. 'B' is harder to measure than 'A' so I will try to make a tool to reliably measure 'B' on all my available base castings. Once I have eliminated the castings that are out of spec, I can define the length of an acceptable push rod! The Eccentric that drives the CORVAIR Fuel Pump is shown here, from the shop manual.
