


Dear Friends --

CMI 2016 Schedule/ Upcoming Events



Remember –this map is only for a general idea of routing; your mileage may vary.

Note: Highway 169 is closed south of St. Peter and Highway 14 is closed between Mankato and Courtland (good planning MNDot) so the best way to get to New Ulm is to take Highway 212 west to Brownton and then turn south onto Highway 15 which takes you right into New Ulm. Turn left onto Minnesota Street (KFC/Taco Bell are on the right hand side and there's a sign pointing to Downtown).

Or you can take Highway 212 to Highway 5 south through Arlington and Gaylord. Turn left on Highway 19 to Winthrop and then south on Highway 15.

Thursday the 8th--Cruise In (Car Hop and Shop) runs from 5 to 8pm. Brown County Museum is open all day and has admission during the cruise. Lots of places to eat including Kaiserhoff, George's Steak House spendy great Lamplighter, Lolas. Also open for drinks are Rodney's, American Legion, B&L Bar, and Mowas. Most stores are open as well.

Friday the 9th--Breakfast at Perkins starting at 8am.



A neat Trunk lite by Joe Schwert

At last month's CMI meeting (Wagner's Schwert was Drive-in) Joe showing off his great Early. His car has many built-in gadgets. One of them is this automatic trunk lite with a manual override. This trunk lite is clean, LEDbright and automatic. As some of you may recall the Earlies have their torsion bar (for the trunk lid support) inside the trunk and accessible. Accessible for what? You might ask... well, let's take a look. He has mounted a contact switch and a toggle switch together on the torsion bar. When the lid goes up, Joe's device moves with the bar - closing the



fused circuit that lights a bar of white LEDs mounted onto the deck lid. If you want to have the lid open for some time and wish to manually darken the lite, Joe has built in a manual override.



Here we see the entire setup with the lite turned on – automatically. Joe also has an automatic Engine compartment lite that lights up the oil-dipstick for night-time checking.

What we don't see

is how nicely he did his Dual Master cylinder. We should look at other member's handiwork to see the good jobs they are all doing. Here's Joe's Dual MC sitting just past his custom lite setup. Looks as if he needs some color in the fluid in the washer jar.

Let's all thank Joe for sharing his ideas with us.








IMPROVED HOLE PUNCH

Hey, remember last month when I told you about that rubber gasket for the gas line? I said the hole in the middle was not in the center as centering was not critical. That's still true but it would be nice to reduce the reject rate, so I don't waste so many of my scrap pieces.

I asked the Directors, at a meeting last week, for suggestions. I got some that I didn't understand and some I rejected AND THEN JIM Becker drew one on a napkin that looked catchy, but I didn't get it. I asked him to explain it and he did, a couple times - - till all of a sudden I saw it! Brilliant, I said. "I'll do it!" Thanks, Jim.



My original problem was that I could punch the two holes but not get one of them centered on the other, giving me an eccentric gasket. Not desirable! I needed a way to line-up the two punched holes, using two separate punches. This is a sketch, by me, of Jim's suggestion. He said to make a filler that fits inside the big punch

and let the outside of this device guide the big punch because the

bump on the device is stuck in the first hole...obviously, punch the smaller hole first.

So, I made what I thought would do just that. I did not get what I had hoped for, as the device sat inside the big punch but would not stay where I put it. This is what I got. Nowhere near close enough! Sure, you could use such a gasket but I was not satisfied

with that outcome.





So, I made another device. This one was a lot taller than the first and it fit inside the big punch and looked good. Here's what I got with that one. Maybe it was a little better but certainly not acceptable, I thought.

So, I made an even longer one. This one was so big I had to shorten it after I made it as it was too long to fit inside the big punch. See the gaskets that I made...three in a row that are good enough to work inside the flare fitting. Anyone who wants to stop those pesky gas leaks can come over for lessons. This is the 9mm punch I made just for this project.

Oh, somebody mentioned that 9mm and 3/8' are nearly the same size, so I punched a hole in my material with a 3/8" punch and the disc I cut out would not stay in the flare fitting. I measured my "9mm" discs and they are about 0.005" bigger then 3/8". 3/8" is 0.375" and the inside of the threads

of the fitting measures 0.400", and my discs come in ~0.380".
