












Corvair Minnesota at GMCCA



Late Model Rear Suspension: Torque Arm Bushing on the Toe-In Plate

Once upon a time I changed out these bushings. It's an involved process, unless you have everything off anyway. Here's an exploded view of the Torque Arm. The spring, shock and axle have been removed! I've included a photo of the job site.




The power train pushes the vehicle by shoving this arm against the toe-in plate. The Toe-In plate can be moved left or right to adjust the toe-in of that rear wheel. The bushing in question is pressed into the end of the Torque Arm and is bolted to the toe-in plate. Here's a nice factory sketch of that part of our discussion.

When I had this off I replaced all the bushings on the vehicle including these big guys. Recently I noticed a strange rubbing sound and found that one of the bushings had changed its position on the end of the torque Arm. I had my son Peter under there to do the real checking! The toe-in plate had not moved but the wheel was now doing a serious toe-in on that side. The Torque Arm had moved at least ½", inboard. Rear wheel toe-in is spec'd at 1/8", so adding a ½" is a big NO-NO!

Solution: push it back where it belongs! This meant taking out the spring and disconnecting the brake line, the shock absorber and even the little front strut rod. Then dropping the toe-in plate down to examine and reposition. Reposition meant making up a group of fittings that matched all those pieces and using a big bolt through the middle to squeeze it back in place.


Turns out it went back pretty easy. Which is why it came out of its place - pretty easy.

Once back in place -fully seated in the Torque Arm - it was easy to see exactly where it belonged as there are four bumps built into the bushing to use as positioning stops or 'bumps' for the press.

Here's a sketch of the bushing.





Now it's back where it belongs and I have my laser setup that makes re-alignment a snap. So, all I need do is shoot it with a little high current and some wire and it will hopefully stay put.

This photo, on the left, shows the bushing fully engaged into the Torque Arm, but actually not secure. You can see clearly how closely the bumps are pushed against the extrusion of the torque Arm. I'm pretty certain that when I put it in there, I thought the sleeve was tight inside that big hole.



Obviously the picture on the right is not pretty. I could grind it down and shine up the weld so it would make a nicer picture but I watched as the arc hit right on the joint where the bump was pressed in tight. I just held the trigger a little longer to give it a some extra heat! I arc'd three of the four bumps so I'm thinking it will hold. I will certainly go back to check it later, just to be certain. Promise!
