New Year New Board

I'm happy to be the new Vice President of Corvair Minnesota. CMI has a rich tradition of Tech Sessions being an integral part of our monthly meetings and I would like to see that continue. Many thanks to Gary Nelson who has served well in that capacity for several years now. We've certainly been happy with him but he's termed out under the By-Laws.

I did a little solo barnstorming exercise the other day while I was waiting for the wood stove in the garage to catch by writing down tech topics and quickly filled a page. Some of the ideas involve learning more about things I know very little about so I'd like to call on others to participate. It's would be a little dry if it's just me prattling on for 30 minutes. I'd also like folks to let me know if there's something you're interested in, perhaps some project on your Corvair you'd like to tackle yourself but it's a little scary. Sometimes it's harder to make the decision to begin than it is to get it done.

I started working on Corvairs with my brothers in about 1969 at age 13. My second car was a Corvair in about 1975 and I've had at least one ever since, most of them just passing fair. Much of my training has come from the school of hard knocks and I'm pretty well set in some methods of doing things that could very well be wrong. I believe I've read every Corvair book ever written and visit Corvair Center forum every day trying to learn more. Many of you know far more than I so Tech Sessions can be where I can learn from you as well. Come let us reason together.

I have a shop at home and our new President Dave Pedersen has been my associate for a few years now. Both of us turned to this vocation in our 50s after our old jobs of 30 years went away from us, of course through no fault of our own. This situation is almost akin to having two people from the same family on the CMI Board. I've always tried to keep my Corvair business concerns and my Corvair club concerns separate and we will both try to keep that pledge. Please speak up if we seem to be operating with self service or promotion, it's easy for that stuff to creep in.

We are transitioning into a new CMI Activities Director as I'm jumping jobs in the middle of a 2 year term. We the old BOD carefully considered it and asked around and we have a wonderful candidate who has agreed. It is however the job of the new BOD to appoint someone at the BOD meeting in January so I don't know if it's proper to talk about it yet but I think it's good.

For the January Tech Session, yesterday we were wrangling with a LM gas gauge that reads 1/8 with 5 gallons. After removing the sender we found it reads ½ tank on the gauge when placed halfway through the travel and an ohm meter check seems appropriate. It's common consensus that the float should point to the rear but we wondered if it was hanging up on the side of the tank so I cut open a rusty tank for a look inside. How this pans out remains to be seen and hopefully more is learned by meeting time. The LM and EM senders have different ohm values to match the gauge and FCs are considered EM ohm-wise. The '60 gas tank is smaller but '61-69 are the same although EM and LM have different filler necks. FC tanks have 2 styles, in '63 ½ they have a hole in the center for the improved shifter to run through. I have a tank that was done at Tank Renu in Shakopee. Shipping on a new tank is like \$80 these days. I prefer an original sender that works to a shiny new Made in China. Installing a gas tank in a Corvair car is one of my least favorite jobs. My associate seems to be better at it than me, perhaps being somewhat slippery and shifty has its advantages. Ha!


GROUNDING the GENerator

Not a BIG worry but this is something I often see but rarely comment on.

Note, in this copy of the LM ('65) shop manual. We see no mention of a ground connection on either


the GEN or the REG. Of course, nobody worries about grounding the GEN because you unknowingly ground it when you tighten the bolts. You don't have to say that! But that also means the new guy has never heard about it. The Plus terminal on the GEN goes to the BATT but it can't charge the BATT unless there is a NEG connection. When you don't show it, the new guy doesn't get the message.

Take the REG, that sits right next to the GEN on this chart, its ground wire is a critical component that is needed to Regulate (Control) the Voltage from the



GEN, but again is not shown. The GEN-FAN lite (on the Dash) supplies current, from the Key, to the BRN wire (shown as 20 BRN) that goes through the REG and continues on through the GEN - - - to GROUND. The Dash light (called a Tell-Tale Lite, by the factory) tests the system's wiring connections every time you turn on the Key. When the Tell-Tale lights, that means all systems are "go".

It's interesting that this drawing in the '65 manual does show the Engine being grounded, but nothing else.



In the 50's when they 'drew' all the pictures in a shop manual, they included the ground wires even where there were two of them right next to each other. See this Old Distributor drawing where the points are Grounded and the Capacitor is too!

Let's have fun, and stay grounded, while we Keep-On-CORVAIRing!






